Taking relief on Greenback holes # 3 and #13

Red Stakes 17.1(d) Hole #3

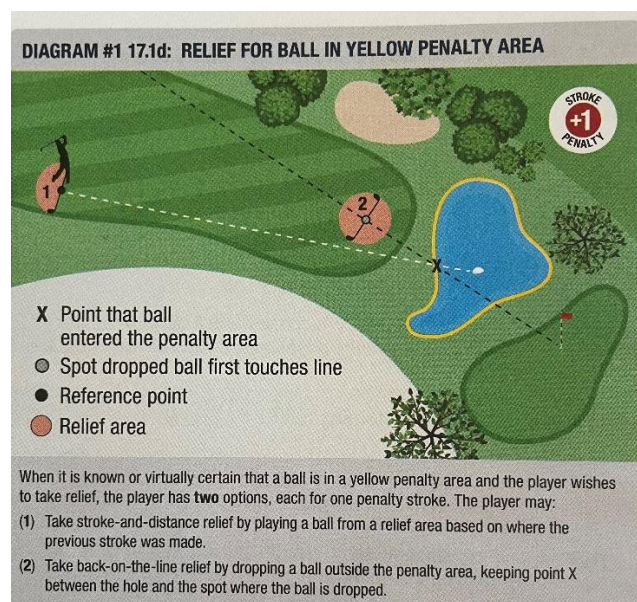
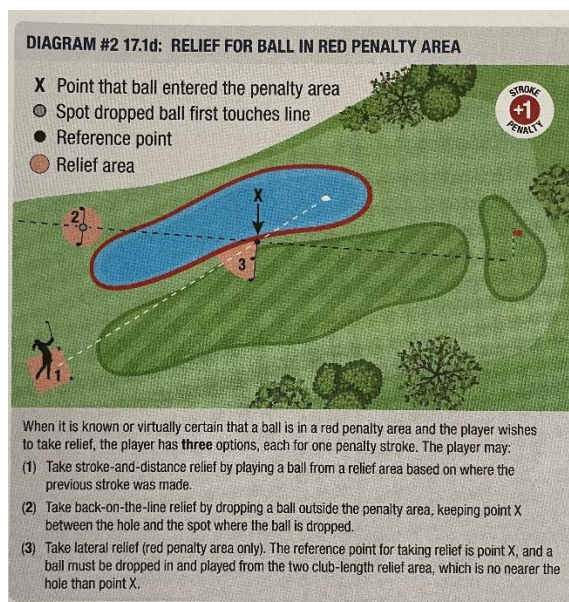
While 3 options are available for taking relief marked by red stakes, you may find your best option on hole # 3 is to use the provided drop zone.

1. Take stroke-and-distance relief by playing a ball from a relief area based on where the previous stroke was made.
2. Take back-on-the-line relief by dropping a ball outside the penalty area, keeping point X between the hole and the spot where the ball was dropped.
3. Take lateral relief (red penalty only). The reference point for taking relief is the point where the ball crossed the hazard and must be dropped in and played from the two club-length relief area, which is no nearer to the hole. This option would be difficult to achieve on this hole.

Yellow Stakes 17.1(d) Hole #13

When your ball travels over the water hazard beyond the penalty area and bounced or rolled back into the yellow stake penalty area, the player has these relief options for a one stroke penalty;

1. Take stroke-and-distance relief by playing a ball from a relief area based on where the previous stroke was made.
2. Take back-on-the-line relief by dropping a ball outside the penalty area, keeping point X between the hole and the spot where the ball was dropped.
